

The Board of Commissioners met for the second public hearing for Updates to Flood Damage Reduction Regulations at 9 A.M. Those present were: Rick Perales and Richard D. Gould.

PUBLIC HEARING

The second public hearing for Updates to Flood Damage Reduction Regulations was called to order by the Vice President at 9 a.m.

Al Kuzma, Chief Building Official for Greene County and Floodplain Administrator for the unincorporated areas of the County, explained that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) directs states to enforce floodplain regulations in order for communities to be eligible for the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

FEMA updated maps and the regulations to maintain that qualification for the NFIP, he said. Mr. Kuzma asked that the Board vote in favor of the regulations in order to maintain good standing with the federal insurance program.

No one spoke for or against the updates.

Mr. Perales asked if there were a lot of citizen comments on the changes. Mr. Kuzma said public meetings about the minor changes to the map were held with a few citizens and local elected officials in attendance.

The public hearing was closed at 9:05 a.m.
